

ORDINANCE NO. 896

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF ANY VEHICLE AND/OR TRAILER LARGER THAN 1 1/2 TONS ON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND WAYS OF THE CITY OF FAIRFIELD AND TO PROHIBIT THE OPERATIONS OF SUCH VEHICLE AND/OR TRAILER ON ANY PUBLIC STREET OR WAY NOT DESIGNATED A TRUCK ROUTE AND DESIGNATE CERTAIN STREETS AS TRUCK ROUTES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Fairfield City Council as follows:

By adding to the Fairfield City Code the following:

Section 11-14(a):

"It shall be unlawful for any person to park on the public street or alleys in the Corporate limits of the City of Fairfield any truck and/or trailer larger than 1 1/2 tons at any time, except while loading and unloading, which is to be only the actual time necessary for the loading and unloading and no more."

Section 11-14(b):

"It shall be unlawful for any person to operate on any public street or alley in the corporate limits of the City of Fairfield, which street or alley has not been designated a truck route, any truck and/or trailer larger than 1 1/2 tons at any time except for the actual time necessary to make a local delivery. Except nothing in this Ordinance shall prevent any business holding a valid license to do business in the City of Fairfield which business has as its principle place of operation any location which is not located on a designated truck route from parking any truck and/or trailer larger than 1 1/2 tons or from operating such truck and/or trailer by the most direct route from a designated truck route to the principle place business."


Section 11-14(c):

"The following streets and ways within the City of Fairfield are designated as truck routes: Arron Aronov Drive from the Fairfield City limits north-west to the intersection of Valley Road; Valley Road from the City limits north-east to the intersection of Valley Road and Commerce Avenue/53rd Street; Commerce Avenue from Valley Road and Crawford Street; Crawford Street north-west to the Commerce Avenue from Crawford Street north and thence north-east to 36th Street; 36th Street from the City limits south-east to Lloyd Noland Parkway; Lloyd Noland Parkway south-west from the City limits to Interstate 59/20. Provided however that the Chief of Police may designate other truck routes for such periods as may be necessary and convenient to the public welfare upon request by a person and after public notice."

Section 11-14(d):

"Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding \$250.00."


